OVERVIEW



PBEO JOB FAIR

This Dec. 6 – 9, the Gaylord Opryland Resort & Convention



Center in Nashville, Tennessee, will host the 2015 PBEO Job Fair, presented by DeVry University. Each year at the Baseball Winter Meetings, the Job Fair gives individuals seeking employment in the baseball industry the opportunity to meet with club executives and interview onsite for a variety of available positions.

The process is simple and streamlined. Job Fair attendees can search jobs ranging from internships to full-time positions, then apply, interview and receive offers all while at the Baseball Winter Meetings. With December marking the height of the baseball hiring season, an average of 400 − 500 jobs are posted each year for a similar number of job seekers. Most clubs are hiring for positions beginning in January 2016, with Short Season-A™ and Rookie® level clubs hiring for later in the year. For a list of short season clubs, visit the classification page on www.Milb.com. Historically, the split for full-time versus internship positions is about 70 percent/30 percent, and we cannot guarantee how many full-time positions will be posted.

JOB FAIR PROCESS

The Job Posting Room, which opens on Sunday, Dec. 6, at 3:30 p.m., immediately following the conclusion of the Business of Baseball Workshop, is where all of the available positions will be numbered and posted according to category (e.g., Ticket Sales, Stadium Operations, Marketing & Promotions, etc.). When you find a position for which you would like to apply, write the job number, title and the phone number where you can be reached while in Nashville on your résumé, before submitting into its respective résumé drop box. You will need a separate résumé for each

position for which you are applying. It is encouraged that you make numerous copies of your résumé before arriving to the Baseball Winter Meetings. However, there are on-site services offered by the hotel for a fee should you need to utilize them.

Business attire is suggested, especially for interviews. For men, a jacket and tie are recommended while a suit/dress/pants/skirt with collared shirt is suggested for women. For special events throughout the week, attire ranges from casual to business. Keep in mind your potential future employer may be on-site during the week, so a presentable and professional appearance is recommended at all times.

REGISTRATION

Online registration with a major credit card can be completed by visiting www.PBEO.com, or by filling out and returning the attached form along with payment by Oct. 23, 2015, for a discounted rate. After this date, registrations will only be taken on-site (cash or credit card only) and registration fees will increase by \$50. If you are a current PBEO member, your subscription must run through Dec. 9, 2015, to register at the Current Member rate. If it does not, you must register as a Non-Member, which would extend your PBEO membership by another year.

On-site registration counters will open at 7 a.m. on Sunday, Dec. 6. 

PBEO JOB FAIR & BASEBALL WINTER MEETINGS GENERAL ATTENDANCE POLICY

The Baseball Winter Meetings are not open to the general public. In order to attend, you must be (i) a member of The National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues Inc., d/b/a Minor League Baseball, or Major League Baseball, (ii) a Baseball Trade Show exhibitor, (iii) a PBEO Job Fair attendee, or (iv) an Approved Non-Member. Non-Member applications must be approved prior to registration and will be considered on a case-by-case basis, in Minor League Baseball's sole and absolute discretion

Minor League Baseball and Major League Baseball clubs and leagues may only register, purchase additional tickets or name badges, and request housing for individuals who are employed by their organization.

Any company that is in the business of selling a product or service to any Minor League or Major League Baseball club or league can only attend the Baseball Winter Meetings as a Baseball Trade Show exhibitor.

Any professional or amateur sports league, club, or organization must go through the Non-Member approval process as mentioned above and will be considered on a case-by-case basis, in Minor League Baseball's sole and absolute discretion.

Minor League Baseball, in its sole and absolute discretion, reserves the right to refuse admittance to any person or entity for any lawful reason. A member that has previously purchased a Name Badge Only may purchase an upgrade to a full registration package that includes tickets to all events by paying the on-site registration fee.

NON-TRANSFERABLE CONVENTION NAME BADGES

A convention name badge serves as a revocable license for admission to the Baseball Winter Meetings, Baseball Trade Show and PBEO Job Fair. Convention name badges are required to gain entry to the Baseball Trade Show. Convention name badges are non-transferable. Convention name badges must be worn at all times and must be presented upon request. Tickets are required to attend special events and are not transferable. Minor League Baseball reserves the right, in its sole and absolute discretion, to terminate an attendee's license at any time and require the attendee to leave the premises.
